Arkansas Point Campground

Electrical Hook-Ups: \$20.00 per night*

All sites include electrical hookups, paved parking pad, sheltered picnic table, and fire ring

Located on the south side of the park with easy access to the south boat ramp, services include: camper registration, park information, flush restrooms, coin-operated showers, coin-operated laundry, playground, water faucets for fill-up only (no water hook-ups available) and dump station. Office hours vary, use self-service for permits when station is closed.

Juniper Breaks Campground

Basic, Non-Electrical Sites: \$16.00 per night*

All sites include paved parking pad, sheltered picnic table, and fire ring

Centrally located in the park, services include: self-service camper registration, vault toilet facilities, and water faucets for fill-up only (no water hook-ups available).

Northern Plains Campground Complex

Prairie Ridge, Eagle View and Yucca Flats

Electrical Hook-Ups: \$20.00 per night*

All sites include electrical hookups, paved parking pad, sheltered picnic table, and fire ring

Located on the north side of the park with easy access to the north boat ramp, services include: camper registration, park information, restrooms, coin-operated showers, coin-operated laundry, playground, water faucets for fill-up only (no water hook-ups available) and dump station. Office hours vary, use self-service for permits when station is closed.

Kettle Creek

Basic, Non-Electrical Sites: \$16.00 per night*

All sites include paved parking pad, sheltered picnic table, and fire ring

Services include: vault toilet facilities, and water faucets for fill-up only (no water hook-ups available). Seven unique walk-in sites are also available on a first-come-first serve basis. Walk-in sites have limited amenities and only one parking space big enough to hold one passenger vehicle.

***All vehicles must have a valid daily or Annual Colorado State Park Pass for every day the vehicle is in the park. This fee is in addition to the camping fees.**

***Camping fees are reduced on Sunday through Thursday nights (excluding holidays) for valid Colorado Aspen Leaf holders.**

Reservation Information

Take the worry out of your stay; make sure you have a campsite with a reservation!

Reservations are strongly recommended. Campgrounds often fill to capacity on the weekends from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Weekdays through the summer are also very busy. After reservations, sites at the park are first-come-first-served. Sites purchased at the park cannot be guaranteed for more than two (2) days.

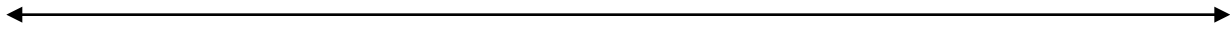
Sites must be reserved through the Colorado State Park's reservation system:

Reservations must be made at least three (3) days in advance minimum and six (6) months maximum. A \$10.00 non-refundable reservation fee is required for every site.



Campground Rules

- Camping is allowed in designated areas only.
- A valid park pass is required on every vehicle for every day you are staying in the campground.
- All open fires must be contained in the fire rings and grills provided.
- Never leave a fire unattended. Extinguish all fires completely.
- A valid camping permit or reservation must be purchased and posted at all times at the marker at your site.
- In order to obtain a camping permit, a member of the camping party must be present and ready to make immediate occupancy of the campsite or a reservation must be made through the campground reservation system.
- The maximum stay is fourteen (14) days within a forty five (45) day period.
- Camping permits and reservations expire at 12:00 noon.
- No more than one single family or single group per site. A single group will be limited to six (6) individuals.
- Only one camping unit per campsite. A camping unit consists of one of the following combinations...
 - One passenger vehicle and two tents.
 - One motorized vehicle towing one camp trailer and one tent.
 - One additional passenger vehicle may be parked on the pavement at the site if space permits. If there is not enough room, additional vehicles must be parked in designated parking spaces.
 - Separate campsites will be required if more than one camping unit is used by a family or group, even if members of the same family are involved.
- Be considerate! Quiet hours are strictly enforced from 10:00 pm to 6:00 am.
- Help us protect our natural resources by keeping all vehicles and trailers on the pavement at all times.
- Use of off-highway vehicles and motorized scooters is not allowed in the park.
- **NO wood cutting or gathering is allowed in the park.** Firewood is for sale at the Ranger Stations.
- All pets must be leashed (maximum of 6 feet in length) when outside your vehicle or RV.
- Pets are welcomed in the park, but cleaning up after your pet is required by law.
- Do not leave unattended, barking dogs in your campsite.
- The use of fireworks of any kind or nature is strictly prohibited.
- Dump all waste water (including dish water and grey water) down the dump-station sewer drains.
- Vehicles, trailers, and personal property cannot be left unattended in the park for more than twenty-four (24) hours.

Failure to follow rules and regulations can result in a fine or eviction.
